2017 SC District Leadership Workshop was held January 14, 2017, at Swan Lakes Visitor Center in Sumter, SC. Governor-Elect Anna Nunnery and Leadership Coordinators Shirley King and Shirley Patterson invited all as follows:

Governor Elect Anna Nunnery welcomed everyone after each attendee registered, grabbed some snacks, and found their seats. She introduced the theme for the day as Work Together - Share Together - Succeed Together.



Leadership Coordinator Shirley Patterson presented the 1st topic: Work Together. She provided further insight with the able assistance of several Pilots to show us how the "V" flight pattern used by geese works. The important ideas presented were:

- * all geese are leaders and followers at some point since they alternate leadership
- * communication exists within, allowing them to fly 70% farther as team vs. individually
- * geese help each other by caring for each other



All attendees then had to put these ideas into practice with the tower of cards project.
